

INTRODUCTION

- * "Focusing on the Messiah in the book of Matthew" ... Matthew was a Jewish man writing about the Jewish Messiah to a Jewish audience.
- * The Message of John and Jesus was the same: "Repent (*metanoia* - *change the way you think*) for the kingdom of the Heavens has drawn near!"
- * That message then permeates all of His other messages as He teaches, and demonstrates to, His followers how to become "fishers of men."
- * Over the past couple of weeks we have been in the section of Matthew's gospel that is commonly referred to as the sermon on the Mount. This section of teaching reveals the Standards of the Messianic Kingdom. Jesus (the Messiah) speaks with the authority of a king - The King!
- * The Standards of the Kingdom are different from those of the world - hence, the need to change the way we think! They are also Higher Standards; they are standards which look to the Perfect of God! Instead of looking at the outward acts, Jesus called upon men to examine their hearts.
- * Last week, we continued this consideration of the Standard of the Kingdom beginning to look at chapter 6 in which Jesus reveals that the Kingdom Standard is a Definitive Standard ... there is NO middle ground. You are either focusing on men and the world ... or ... You are focusing on God and His kingdom!
- * There are two basic questions you can ask yourself to determine what your true inward focus is: Whose applause are you seeking? and Whose treasure are you seeking?
- * Today, we consider the second of those questions.

* *Your heart will be revealed in three specific areas*

1. IN YOUR I _____ (v. 19-21)

2. IN YOUR D _____ (v. 22-24; 1 John 2:15)

3. IN YOUR A _____ (v. 25-34)

SUMMARY: Those who seek the treasures of the earth will serve materialism and will experience the balance of their reward here on the earth. Those who seek the treasures of heaven will serve God and will experience the balance of their rewards in the Kingdom eternally!
